Dear Colleagues:

Tulane University prepares for emergency situations through our Office of Emergency Preparedness & Response. Comprehensive procedures are in place to ensure effective and well-managed actions in the event of university emergencies. While our office manages threats and emergency situations year-round, we want to share a few best practices and reminders as we prepare for the 2023-24 academic year.

## **EMERGENCY ALERTS**

Should the need arise for us to send an emergency alert (called TU Alerts), you will receive it via text message, phone call, email, and/or Everbridge app. To receive emergency text alerts (the most common way we send alerts): • Make sure your cell phone number is listed in your portal

in Gibson.

**Download the Everbridge app**, available for free in the App Store and Google Play store and select Tulane University as your organization, then log in with your Tulane credentials.

Tulane University: T U ALERT: A tornado WARNING has been issued for our area. Remain in/seek shelter in the nearest building immediately.

When a tropical storm or hurricane threatens the New Orleans area, the university will notify employees about cancellations, closures, and if the university will shelter in place or evacuate via email, text message, and the university's emergency website (tulane.edu/emergency).

If a university closure order is given, employees will not be allowed to remain on any of the university's campuses or use Tulane University buildings as storm shelters, unless designated as essential personnel by the Office of Emergency Preparedness & Response. Additionally, no employees except designated essential personnel will be allowed to seek shelter with Tulane students who are evacuated by the university. As you create your personal plan, please make accommodations for working and/or teaching remotely for at least a week.



Following a university closure, the university will provide updated information, including when  $% \left( 1\right) =\left( 1\right) \left( 1\right)$ you may return to the university's facilities, via email, text message, and on the university's emergency website, **tulane.edu/emergency**. Do **NOT** return to any of the university's campus facilities until university leadership has communicated that it is safe to do so.
